### Tech for Teaching

A two-day workshop for kaiako who are teaching in any learning area and at any level, who want to develop their confidence, knowledge, and use of web-based apps and tools to support your teaching, student learning, assessments and keeping whānau informed and up to date. This is an opportunity to see some web-based apps and tools (some oldies but goodies, and some newbies) in action and how they can be used in your classroom. We will spend time exploring a diverse range of web-based apps and tools, as well as allowing time for you to set up and start using at least three apps and/or tools, meaning you can head straight back to school and start using and applying what you've learned!
